The actions taken to promote active travel journeys

- Publication and distribution of the Cardiff Walking and Cycling Map
- Provision of walking and cycling information on Keeping Cardiff Moving website
- Provision of free cycle stands to organisations through the Park Your Bike scheme
- Free adult cycling training offered to anybody living, working or studying in Cardiff
- Cycle training in schools
- Cycle training to youth groups
- School holiday cycle training
- Police cycle training
- Independent travel training for schoolchildren with special needs and vulnerable adults
- Supporting the setting up of walking buses at Ysgol y Wern and Severn Road Primary
- Provision of travel information on One Planet website
- One Planet schools event
- The Annual Walking Festival hosted through the Outdoor Cardiff partnership was held in May 2015, linking with the Big Welsh Walk, Walk to School week, Walk to Work week and Vale of Glamorgan Walking Festival
- Publication of 'Putting Your Best Foot Forward' full page spread in March edition of Big Issue
- Publication of 'Year of Adventure' double page spread and 'Get Outdoors & Explore' double page spread in Around Town Student Magazine Spring Edition

The actions taken to secure new active travel routes and related facilities and improvements

- Construction of active travel schemes:
 - o Cycle Route 5 Penarth Road – off road shared use facility
 - o Cycle Route 9 Colum Road – cycle lanes on Colum Road and junction improvements at Colum Road/North Road
 - o Cardiff to Newport Cycle Route Phase 1 – creation of off road route between Cypress Drive and Greenway Road
 - o Cycle Route 6 Toucan and footway improvements at Cowbridge Road East
 - o Cycle Route 50 Ninian Park Road on road cycle route, traffic calming and pedestrian crossing improvements
 - o Westgate Street Crossing

- Provision of improved crossing facilities and shared use cycle paths as part of A469 Caerphilly Road scheme
- Provision of cycle facilities as part of Windsor Road Bridge scheme
- Pedestrian improvements as part of Heol Pontpennau scheme
- Clare Road / Penarth Road Junction Improvements – new controlled pedestrian crossings plus cycle stand provision at new Grange Hub
- Cowbridge Road West / Narbeth Road Gulley – lighting, CCTV and surface improvements
- Kimberley Terrace, Llanishen – Creation of small pedestrian area with seating and cycle stands in central location within local shopping centre.
- Wentloog road Shops, Rumney – New pedestrian crossing and cycle stands
- Parc Coed y Nant, Llanedeyrn - Installation of lighting for pedestrian routes through parkland
- Coed Y Gores - Installation of railings to deter motor-cycle use of pedestrian walkways.

- Cycle Route 50 Phase 2 Off road cycle facility at Leckwith Road
- Safe Routes in Communities Splott Phase 2
- Eastern Corridor Walkable Neighbourhoods Phase 2 – pedestrian crossing improvements at Newport Road and Countisbury Avenue
- Western Corridor Walkable Neighbourhoods – pedestrian crossing at Caerau Lane
