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Executive Summary

- On 31st August 2014, over a quarter (26.5%) of children in Cardiff were in low-income families, which exceeded the proportions for both Wales (22.5%) and the UK (20.0%).
- Cardiff's figure at the end of August 2014 was the third highest in Wales, behind only Blaenau Gwent (30.0%), and Merthyr Tydfil (27.8%).
- All of the twenty-two Welsh local authorities had seen their proportion rise between 2013 and 2014, with Cardiff's increase of 2.2 percentage points the joint-fourth largest of these.
- Cardiff was a mid-ranking performer across the Core Cities and Edinburgh with the fifth lowest figure at the end of August 2014. Its growth of 2.2 percentage points between 2013 and 2014 was just the fifth largest with its relative position remaining unchanged at fifth lowest in both years
- Although around a quarter (26.5%) of children across the local authority as a whole were deemed to be living in low-income families, this figure ranged from just 5.2% in Rhiwbina to almost half in Ely (47.5%), with sixteen of the twenty-nine wards exceeding the proportion for Wales (22.5%).
- Since the end of August 2013, all but two of Cardiff's twenty-nine electoral wards had seen a rise in their rate of children in low-income families, with the only exceptions being Cathays (-2.0 percentage points) and Llanrumney (-0.2 percentage points). The greatest expansion occurred in Grangetown (+5.3 percentage points), followed by Llandaff North (+4.6 percentage points), Butetown (+4.0 percentage points) and Ely (+4.0 percentage points).
- When looking at the distribution of children of low-income families by lower super output area (LSOA), it can be seen that the highest levels were mainly concentrated within the southern arc, in particular Ely where eight of its ten LSOAs had at least two-fifths of their children living in low-income families (including four that had more than half).
- In total, fifteen of Cardiff's 214 LSOAs had more than half of their children living in low-income families. The wards containing LSOAs of this type were Adamsdown, Butetown, Caerau, Cathays, Ely, Llanrumney, Pentwyn, Plasnewydd, Splott, and Trowbridge. The LSOA with the highest rate was Cathays 7 (62.9%), followed by Ely 5 (60.2%), Pentwyn 3 (59.5%), and Trowbridge 8 (56.4%).
- Of the 214 LSOAs in Cardiff, 147 (68.7%) saw their proportion of children in low-income families increase over the year, while 66 (30.8%) experienced a decrease, and one (0.5%) saw no change.

Introduction

The Children in Low-Income Families Local Measure¹ is the proportion of children² living in families either in receipt of (means-tested) out-of-work benefits, or in receipt of tax credits with a reported income which is less than 60 per cent of national median income.

This measure provides a broad proxy for relative low-income child poverty as set out in the Child Poverty Act, where a child is defined as being in relative poverty if they live in a household where income is less than 60 per cent of the equivalised national median income, and enables analysis at a local level. However, it is not precisely equivalent due to several differences in the data used. These include the children captured (for example, there may be children in families in receipt of out of work benefits where income is above the 60 per cent threshold), and the time period covered (the national measure is on a financial year basis, this measure is a snapshot at 31st August).

Figures are available from HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) for all children (i.e. all dependent children under the age of 20) and for those aged under 16. This report, however, focuses on the data for all children.

A dependent child is defined as an individual under 16 or an individual aged 16 to 19 years who is:

- i. Not married nor in a Civil Partnership nor living with a partner; and
- ii. Living with parents; and
- iii. In full-time non-advanced education or in unwaged government training.

Children in Low-Income Families in Welsh Local Authorities

The percentage of children deemed to be living in low-income families in each Welsh local authority at the end of August 2014 (latest figures) can be seen in Table 1, along with comparisons with the previous year. This indicates that, on 31 August 2014, over a quarter (26.5%) of children in Cardiff were in low-income families, which exceeded the proportions for both Wales (22.5%) and the UK (20.0%)³.

³ The Wales and UK estimates show the aggregation of the small area estimates of the proportion of children in poverty. This allows an area's small area estimate of children in poverty to be compared with the Region it lies within. However, for National Statistics data on child poverty at Regional level, please refer to the Department of Work and Pensions' Households Below Average Income publication which uses the relative child poverty measure as set out in the Child Poverty Act. The small area estimates are not directly comparable with the national figures.




Figure 1: Percentage of Children in Low-Income Families in Wales by Local Authority, 31st August 2014

Figure 1 shows that, at the end of August 2014, Cardiff's figure was the third highest in Wales, behind only Blaenau Gwent (30.0%), and Merthyr Tydfil (27.8%). Meanwhile, the lowest rates could be seen in Monmouthshire and Powys (both 14.2%); both of which were just over half of the proportion for Cardiff.

All of the twenty-two local authorities had seen their proportion rise between 2013 and 2014, with this ranging from 1.2 percentage points in Bridgend to 3.8 percentage points in Ceredigion (see Table 1). Cardiff's increase of 2.2 percentage points was the joint-fourth largest growth across the Welsh local authorities and exceeded those of Wales (+2.0 percentage points) and the UK (+1.8 percentage points). Overall, Cardiff's relative position deteriorated slightly with it becoming the authority with the third highest rate in Wales; up from fourth highest in both 2012 and 2013 (jointly).

Children in Low-Income Families in the Core Cities and Edinburgh

Table 2 shows the percentage of children deemed to be living in low-income families in the core cities and Edinburgh at the end of August 2014, along with comparative figures for 2013.

At the end of August 2014, Cardiff (26.5%) was a mid-ranking performer with its figure being the fifth lowest across the cities (see Figure 2). Edinburgh (16.8%) was the only city with a proportion below those of Wales and the UK, while Manchester had the highest rate of 36.0%.

The proportion had increased in each of the eleven local authorities between 2013 and 2014, with Birmingham experiencing the greatest rise of 4.5 percentage points; five times that seen in Bristol (+0.9 percentage points). Cardiff's growth of 2.2 percentage points was just the fifth largest with its relative position remaining unchanged at fifth lowest in both years (see Table 2).

Children in Low-Income Families in Cardiff by Electoral Ward

Table 3 and Figure 3 illustrate the large disparities of children in low-income families across Cardiff's electoral wards at the end of August 2014. Although around a quarter (26.5%) of children across the local authority as a whole were deemed to be living in low-income families, this figure ranged from just 5.2% in Rhiwbina to almost half in Ely (47.5%), with sixteen of the twenty-nine wards exceeding the proportion for Wales (22.5%).

As well as Ely, Adamsdown (42.9%), Caerau (40.9%), and Splott (40.0%) had at least two-fifths of its children living in low-income families. In addition, this figure exceeded a third in Butetown (39.6%), Trowbridge (38.2%), Llanrumney (35.2%), Pentwyn (35.0%) and Grangetown (34.5%).

Since the end of August 2013, all but two of Cardiff's twenty-nine electoral wards had seen a rise in their rate of children in low-income families, with the only exceptions being Cathays (-2.0 percentage points) and Llanrumney (-0.2 percentage points). The greatest expansion occurred in Grangetown (+5.3 percentage points), followed by Llandaff North (+4.6 percentage points), Butetown (+4.0 percentage points) and Ely (+4.0 percentage points).

Children in Low-Income Families in Cardiff by LSOA

The distribution of children in low-income families across Cardiff at the end of August 2014 by lower super output area (LSOA)⁴ can be seen in Figure 4. This shows that the highest levels were mainly concentrated within the southern arc, in particular Ely where eight of its ten LSOAs had at least two-fifths of their children living in low-income families (including four that had more than half). In addition, the proportion in five of Caerau's seven LSOAs (including one that exceeded 50%), and in three of Adamsdown's five LSOAs (including two that exceeded 50%), was greater than 40%. This was also the case in half of the LSOAs in both Splott (4 of 8 LSOAs, including two that exceeded 50%) and Trowbridge (5 of 10 LSOAs, including one that exceeded 50%).

In total, fifteen of Cardiff's 214 LSOAs had more than half of their children living in low-income families. As well as Ely, Caerau, Adamsdown, Splott and Trowbridge, the other wards containing LSOAs of this type were Butetown, Cathays, Llanrumney, Pentwyn and Plasnewydd. The LSOA with the highest rate was Cathays 7 (62.9%), followed by Ely 5 (60.2%), Pentwyn 3 (59.5%), and Trowbridge 8 (56.4%).

Figure 5 shows the distribution of children in low-income families across the local authority on the 31st August 2013. Comparing this with Figure 4 shows how and where the situation has deteriorated across Cardiff over the year.

At the end of August 2013, just six LSOAs had more than half of their children living in low-income families, with a high of 58.8% in Cathays 9. This was below the greatest rate (62.9%) for the end of August 2014, when fifteen LSOAs fell into this category. In addition to Cathays, the other wards containing LSOAs of this type at the end of August 2013 were Adamsdown, Ely, Pentwyn, and Trowbridge.

A comparison between 31st August 2013 and 31st August 2014 can be seen in Table 4 overleaf. Of the 214 LSOAs in Cardiff, 147 (68.7%) saw their proportion of children in low-income families increase over the year, while 66 (30.8%) experienced a decrease, and one (0.5%) saw no change. The greatest percentage point increase occurred in Cathays, with the rate rising by 25.4 percentage points in Cathays 7; well above the next highest expansions of 17.2 percentage points in Grangetown 9, and 11.4 percentage points in Riverside 1. However, Cathays also accounted for the two largest percentage point declines, with the rate falling by 22.4 percentage points in Cathays 9 and 15.4 percentage points in Cathays 3.
