



Radyr Burn Mound

The remains of a pre-historic burnt mound, created by the debris from heating water with hot stones.

The mound dates back to the Bronze Age (c2300-800BC). An information panel has been installed on site.



Cardiff Castle and Roman Fort

The scheduled area consists of a rectangular walled enclosure (late Roman), containing a Norman motte crowned by a well preserved keep. There is a Medieval entrance gate on the south, plus a range of Medieval buildings on the west, remodelled in the 19th century.



Melingriffith Water Pump

This ingenious pump was built in 1806. It consists of a large wheel with wooden paddles. It was used to pump water up from the Taff feeder into the Glamorganshire Canal.

The pump was comprehensively repaired in 2010. An information panel has been installed near the site.

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Designating Scheduled Monuments

Under the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979, the Welsh Government is required to compile and maintain a Schedule of monuments of national importance. Monuments included in the schedule have statutory protection and are regulated by Cadw, Welsh Government's historic environment service.

There are over 4,000 scheduled monuments in Wales. Scheduled Monuments represent only a small proportion of the total number of known archaeological sites in Cardiff. There are many others of varying importance, recorded on the Historic Environment Record (HER) held by the Glamorgan-Gwent Archaeological Trust (GGAT).

The HER indicates whether archaeological remains are known or likely to exist on a particular site. More information can be found at ggat.org.uk/her/her.

Activities controlled by scheduling

Before any work, alteration or even controlled archaeological excavations can be undertaken at a monument, Scheduled Monument Consent must be obtained from the Welsh Government. This function is administered by Cadw.

It is an offence to carry out works at the site of a scheduled monument without first obtaining consent. Cadw publish detailed guidance giving further information regarding scheduling criteria, grants available and sources of advice (www.cadw.gov.wales).

The use of metal detecting equipment on a scheduled site is illegal without written consent from Cadw.
